TEACHING METHODS: Lectures, videos, and internet research will cover the main concepts in the chapters, and students will be expected to take notes and participate in group discussions. Paper and physical labs will reinforce the concepts, as well as drawing assignments. Daily quizzes will be given to check understanding of the material. Unit tests will cover both lectures and lab material. Students will often work with partners or groups to develop cooperative learning skills. GRADING: Grades in this class will be determined from the following, using a POINT SYSTEM.

- 90-100% = A
- 80-89.9% = B
- 70-79.9% = C
- 30-69.9% = D
- <30% = F

Grades are broken down as follows:

- ▶ Tests / Quizzes / Final Exam = 40%
- ▶ Warm-ups / Labs / Drawings / Classwork = 30%
- ► Homework = 20%
- ▶ Participation = 10%

LABS: Lab, group work, and drawings are a very important part of this course. You will be expected to conduct yourself in a proper manner during all classwork. **Anyone who plays during lab time will be** removed from the class. Labs must be written in the correct format and **must include an Analysis & Conclusion to receive full credit.** Students who miss a formal lab must make up the lab by doing an alternative assignment (see teacher).



HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS: Homework will be turned in on the due date to receive credit. Homework will include reading & answering questions from assigned text and studying for quizzes and tests.

Assignments are due at the beginning of the period to receive credit. Do not copy homework. If caught, both people receive a zero on the assignment.

TARDIES AND ABSENCES: When the bell rings, class begins. You should be working on the WarmUp assignment at the moment the bell rings. **Be prepared:**—make sure you have all required materials (notebooks, pens, pencils, paper, etc.)

NOTEBOOKS: It is recommended that a well-organized notebook be maintained for the length of this course. All work should be kept in the correct section and in chronological order. Notebooks should be brought to class daily. You should have these sections in notebooks:

- 4. Labs/Worksheets

CLASS RULES: Failure to adhere to classroom rules will result in loss of assignment points. **Be respectful at all times** – To fellow students, the teacher, and your classroom

- 1. Be prepared for class paper, pens, notebook, and homework completed.
- 2. **Do not leave your seat** without permission, unless previously arranged with teacher.
- 3. No food, gum, or drinks allowed in class (bottled water is the exception)
- 4. Copying other student's homework is unacceptable.
- 5. **Cell phones should be placed in wall pouch**, unless previously discussed with the teacher.

- 3. Be organized. Take good notes and work neatly and carefully during all labs and activities.
- 4. Absences are **no** excuse for not knowing the material. If you are absent it is **your responsibility** to find out what you have missed and schedule a time to make it up!
- 5. LISTEN. And if you don't understand something, ask me to explain it.

- 3-ring binder to hold papers: This is very important.

 Most hats are okay because they don't cover your ears. Hoods are NOT okay.
- Grooming: Brushing your hair, looking in a mirror, putting on make-up, etc. are all
 distracting and are **not** allowed in my classroom. Absolutely NO "smelly" lotions,
 perfumes, etc. can ever be put on in my classroom!!! Others may have adverse
 reactions!
- <u>Talking:</u> Common sense should tell you that if the teacher or fellow classmate is addressing the class, you should not be talking. If you would like to share something with the entire class- raise your hand and wait to be called.
- <u>Cell phones and smart devices*:</u> I enforce the LAUSD and FHS policies regarding electronic devices. There is a cell phone holder in the classroom to put your device (that has been turned OFF) during instructional time unless otherwise indicated during class time. *Wireless technology used to access electronic devices (iWatch, wireless earbuds, etc.) are included in the electronic device policy and should be OFF and NOT IN USE during instructional time.
 - Note: If a student accesses their cellular device during an assessment, the student will be found in violation of the academic honesty policy and will receive a zero on the assessment, a U in citizenship on the semester report card, and have a comment of 'documented academic dishonesty' included on the semester report card.
 - Students who choose to violate the school and classroom policies and use their cell phones/earbuds during class time will receive a referral to the Dean's office.
